Interim Pastor Message

I have never been one for April Fool's Day - it seemed like trickery or sometimes meanspirited. Maybe it has something to do with my grandparents choosing to get married on April 2nd long ago, "because we did not want anyone calling us April Fools" as my grandmother used to say.

But I do love April! It rains a fair amount, but even that brings new life to the ground. The flowers bud, and the trees begin to show new life. Forsythia bloom by roadways, and small crocuses are pushed aside by daffodils in a full array of yellows. Often Easter coincides with this month, but not always, as with this year. In 2024, April is the month of Eastertide... we can respond to Easter with our ways of living out new life!

Signs of New Life can come from all different places. Listening for God, and keeping our eyes open to the newness is a big part of the practice of new life. After a long day dealing with my husband's PT (which is going well, but I had no idea what a hip replacement entailed!) and helping his brother enter a new chapter in his life helping him learn he will need to enter assisted living due to age and illness, I wanted a poem or Easter prayer about new life. As I sought "Easter poem new life", I saw that a senior center affiliated with the Methodist Church in the Pacific Northwest had posted an Easter poem by resident Elsie M. Brown, 1919-2013.


