From the Interim Pastor



March is said to come in like a lamb and go out like a lion. According to the Farmers' Almanac, the weather folklore stems from ancestral beliefs in balance, meaning if the weather at the start of March was bad (roaring, like a roaring lion), the month should end with good weather (gentle, like a lamb). One theory says this is due to astrology and the sky location of the stars of Leo and Aries in the sky.

Another theory has the saying as biblical: Jesus' first appearance was as the sacrificial lamb, but he will return as the Lion of Judah, hence those symbolic animals. Inconveniently though, the older version definitely put the lion first. Whatever the meaning of that 17th century weather saying, this year, our Lamb of God comes back to life on March 31st, as Easter – that moveable feast -- moves rather early. The symbol of the lion and lamb lying down together is used in both Christianity and Judaism to represent the Messianic Age. In Christianity, according to a sermon by Augustine, the lion stands for Christ resurrected, the lamb for Christ's sacrifice - "He endured death as a lamb; he devoured it as a lion."— Augustine, Sermon 375A.

The Pastor Nominating Committee has begun its work! At the Annual Meeting on February 11, 2024 the congregation elected the Pastor Nominating Committee. This committee works on behalf of the church to search for the next minister. Some people know this process or think they do from past experience and others are wondering how the committee (often referred to as the PNC) will work. The PNC met for the first time 2/26 and were oriented to the work ahead with the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM) Liaison to the First Presbyterian Church of Newton, the Rev. Robin Palmer Burton (Pastor at the Highlands Church), who will continue to meet with the PNC guiding the process and encouraging the PNC. They asked and answered questions and prayed together!

As the Pastor Nominating Committee begins meeting together regularly, they will:

- Get to know one another and bond as a group with laughter and Christian fellowship and prayer.
- Select officers usually a secretary or two (possibly divvying up minutes and correspondence), and a moderator or co-moderators to call meetings and be the contact person(s) and moderate the meetings ably and to help guide the process without anxiety, trusting in the Spirit
- Pray!
- Write the Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP) \rightarrow to be approved by Session and COM
- Remain non-anxious and trust the process!
- Ensure that the MDP gets loaded on the PCUSA leadership website which serves to encourage computer matching and personal applications by pastors who read about this church online with help from the Clerk of Session and Presbytery staff
- Allow the Holy Spirit to work in the process throughout!

As we prepare for our Holy Week together, and recognize the many names we call Jesus and that many ways we understand Christ in our lives, please keep the PNC in your prayers as they work on behalf of the congregation, and as we move forward.

CHURCH RUMMAGE SALE


Saturday, May 18th, from 9-3 pm.

The call to do justice in Micah 6:8 is the focus of the unit the children are exploring in faith formation class. It is not simply a call to distinguish right from wrong. God's justice is restorative, not retributive, and it emerges from a place of deep abiding love. We are learning together to use our eyes and ears to notice injustice in our schools, communities, and nation, and to explore our feelings of compassion for those experiencing injustice. We are also learning how to speak up as individuals and as community members for the voiceless. It is indeed what God requires of us. Faith Formation class takes place on Sunday mornings from 9-10 am, for children preschool through grade 5. We hope your child or children will join us!
